



## AP SPANISH FOUR SUMMER ASSIGNMENT

**OBJECTIVES:** To continue practice using Spanish throughout the summer months so that you don't get "rusty". To prepare for different sections of the AP Spanish Language and Culture Exam.

**DUE DATE:** Friday, August 16. You must have all assignments completed and ready to present to the class.

**I. CONNECT TO GOOGLE CLASSROOM using code: atw25q5**

You will receive reminders of assignments throughout the summer months through Google Classroom. You will also be asked to upload some items on Google Classroom as well. **II. CONNECT TO DUOLINGO CLASSROOM using code: CMAHYJ**

You will need to practice using your Spanish through listening, speaking, reading and writing skills to improve your vocabulary and grammar. Instead of being assigned a specific assignment, you may choose assignments. You will be graded based on your XP points (experience points in the language) each week which come from how much time you spend practicing on Duolingo.

**III. WRITE AN EMAIL RESPONSE IN SPANISH ONCE A MONTH**

You will receive an email in Spanish every month from your teacher's email address: [jedwards@ocssaints.org](mailto:jedwards@ocssaints.org). You must respond in a business-like manner and answer any and all questions posed in the original email. When you respond, please respond by clicking **REPLY**; do not click **REPLY ALL**. Dates you will receive an email: June 1, July 1, August 1. You will respond to each email by June 30, July 31, August 16, respectively.

**IV: READ A SHORT STORY IN SPANISH**

You will choose one of the Spanish short stories listed below. Print a copy of the short story. Highlight new vocabulary terms you learned. Be prepared to tell the class the following items: a summary, background of author, literary genre, cultural notes, theme, and/or mood.

*La siesta del martes* - Gabriel García Márquez

*No oyes ladrar los perros* - Juan Rulfo

*Dos pesos de agua* - Juan Bosch
