Focus on the Family has a wonderful website with hundreds of book reviews from a Christian perspective! I encourage you to visit commonsensemedia.org to preview books before your child reads them. In some cases, you may want to read the book with your child and discuss difficult topics, and don't dismiss reading aloud to each other. They are NOT too old! No matter what they choose to read for pleasure, it is important to simply get them reading. A short, easy read can spark an interest and encourage reluctant readers to keep reading.
